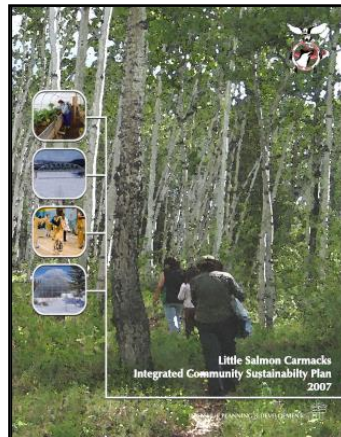

What is an Integrated Community Sustainability Plan?

The Gas Tax Agreement provides funding to incorporated communities and First Nation governments to undertake eligible sustainable infrastructure projects. The Government of Yukon has prepared a plan covering the Yukon's unincorporated communities. To obtain funding, eligible recipients must prepare a plan that identifies infrastructure needs and priorities and looks at economic, environmental, social and cultural development in an integrated fashion. These plans are called "Integrated Community Sustainability Plans"(ICSP).



Little Salmon Carmacks First Nation Integrated Community Sustainability Plan

In 2007, Inukshuk facilitated the preparation of an ICSP for the Little Salmon Carmacks First Nation, and an update of their Capital Plan. The Plan identifies all of the community's infrastructure issues and needs, and promotes a cooperative planning approach with the Village of Carmacks. The Plan reflects the values, goals and priorities of the Little Salmon Carmacks First Nation, and promotes equity and self-government empowerment.

Selkirk First Nation Integrated Community Sustainability Plan

Also in 2007, Selkirk First Nation (SFN) hired Inukshuk to develop a Comprehensive Community Development Plan. SFN required funding for a community water supply improvements. Completion of an ICSP was prerequisite to obtaining that funding.

Inukshuk evaluated community capital improvement needs and assisted the government to identify priorities which were ratified through community consultation. Inukshuk also provided a detailed 10-year financial plan for the community.
