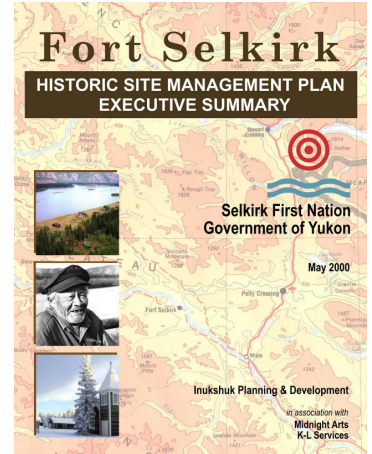
Inukshuk planners work with First Nation communities across western and northern Canada on regional planning, community development and capital planning.

Fort Selkirk Historic Site Management Plan

Fort Selkirk is one of the Yukon's most important heritage sites, a place of great cultural and natural significance. For the past 17 years, the Selkirk First Nation and Yukon government have worked together to research, preserve, restore and interpret the historic town site. Located near the confluence of the Pelly and Yukon rivers, the site was a traditional fishing, trading camp and meeting place for generations of First Nations people.
